Psalms 119

Unto the Lord in mine affliction have I cried, and He heard me. O Lord, deliver my soul from unrighteous lips and from a crafty tongue. What shall be given unto thee and what shall be added

unto thee for thy crafty tongue? The arrows of the mighty one, sharpened with coals of the desert. Woe is me, for my sojourning is prolonged; I have tented with the tentings of Kedar, my soul hath long been a sojourner. With them that hate peace I was peaceable; when I spake unto them, they warred against me without a cause.

Psalm 120

I have lifted up mine eyes to the mountains, from whence cometh my help. My help cometh from the Lord, Who hath made heaven and the earth. Give not thy foot unto moving, and may He not slumber that keepeth thee. Behold, He shall not slumber nor shall He sleep, He that keepeth Israel. When Thou, O Jesus, wentest about * beyond the Jordan in the flesh, Thou didst cry aloud * to those that were with Thee: Lo, Lazarus our friend, being dead, * even now is given over to the grave. * For this, I am glad, My friends, for your sakes, that ye all might learn * that I know all things, being perfect eternal God, * though unto your sight I appear to be man alone. * Let us then go and quicken him, that death clearly may perceive * his own defeat and destruction and

the most perfect of victories * that I shall accomplish, * while bestowing My great mercy and peace upon the world.

Verse 5. Because of Thy Name have I waited for Thee, O Lord; my soul hath waited upon Thy word, my soul hath hoped in the Lord.

Taking Martha and Mary as guides * and our example, let us send forth God-pleasing works * to stand as our intercessors before the Lord, that He might * come to us, ye faithful, raising up our mind * which terribly lieth dead in the dark tomb of heedlessness, * without perception, feeling no fear of God at all, * with no vital force giving life now, and let us cry: * Lo, as Thou once didst raise up Thy friend Lazarus formerly * by Thy dread power, so also do Thou, O Lord, make us all to live, * O merciful Savior, * while bestowing Thy great mercy and peace upon the world.

For the Sixth Wednesday in Tone Six

Verse 4. From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch let Israel trust in the Lord. Lazarus is in the tomb two days, seeing the dead of all ages, beholding strange sights of terror, a great crowd held by the bonds of hell. His relatives grieve bitterly, looking at his tomb. But Christ is coming to bring His friend to life, so that one harmonious song may be sung by all: Blessed art Thou, O Savior, have mercy on us.

For St. Titus in Tone Eight (**O strange wonder**)

Verse 3. For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is abundant redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

O father Titus of godly mind, * when thou didst take up thy cross, * thou didst joyously follow Christ * and didst wholly subjugate * all the passions unto thy soul; * wherefore, much grace from on high didst thou receive * to heal the sufferings of them that flee to thee, * to end infirmities, * and to drive out unclean spirits. For this cause, * we keep feast while celebrating thy memorial.

Verse 2. Praise the Lord, all ye nations; praise Him, all ye people.

Since thou wast sacredly purified * through thine ascetic travails * and, partaking of things divine, * wast enlightened in thy mind, * thou didst truly receive the grace * of the all-holy anointing as a priest * at the Divine Spirit's bidding and command. * And while upon the earth, * thou didst nobly serve thy Maker and thy God * like a holy Angel, O our Father Titus most blest.

Verse 1. For His mercy is great toward us, and the truth of the Lord endureth forever.

O righteous Titus inspired of God, * since Orthodoxy's clear light * ever shone brightly in thy soul, * thou didst cut through and disperse * the gross mist of dark heresy; * and risen up like a star exceeding bright, * thou dost enlighten the farthest ends of earth * always and every hour * with thy brightly shining wonders; for this cause * we all show thee honor and with faith we call thee blest.

THE FIRST OLD TESTAMENT READING

Prokeimenon, in tone 4 (Ps.114)

Reader: I will be well-pleasing before the Lord in the land of the living.

Verse: I am filled with love, for the Lord will hear the voice of my sup-plication.

The reading is from the book of Genesis. (43:26-31; 45:1-16)

When Joseph came home, they brought into the house to him the present which they had with them, and bowed down to him to the ground. And he inquired about their welfare, and said, "Is your father well, the old man of whom you spoke? Is he still alive?" They said, "Your servant our father is well, he is still alive." And they bowed their heads and made obeisance. And he lifted up his eyes, and saw his brother Benjamin, his mother's son, and said, "Is this your youngest brother, of whom you spoke to me? God be gracious to you, my son!" Then Joseph made haste, for his heart yearned for his brother, and he sought a place to weep. And he entered his chamber and wept there. Then he washed his face and came out; and controlling himself he said, "Let food be served."

Then Joseph could not control himself before all those who stood by him; and he cried, "Make every one go out from me." So no one stayed with him when Joseph made himself known to his brothers. And he wept aloud, so that the Egyptians heard it, and the household of Pharaoh heard it. And Joseph said to his brothers, "I am Joseph; is my father still alive?" But his brothers could not answer him, for they were dismayed at his presence. So Joseph said to his brothers, "Come near to me, I pray you." And they came near. And he said, "I am your brother, Joseph, whom you sold into Egypt. And now do not be distressed, or angry with yourselves, because you sold me here; for God sent me before you to preserve life. For the famine has been in the land these two years; and there are yet five years in which there will be neither plowing nor harvest. And God sent me before you to preserve for you a remnant on earth, and to keep alive for you many survivors. So it was not you who sent me here, but God; and He has made me a father to Pharaoh, and lord of all his house and ruler over all the land of Egypt. Make haste and go up to my father and say to him, 'Thus says your son Joseph, God has made me lord of all Egypt; come down to me, do not tarry; you shall dwell in the land of Goshen, and you shall be near me, you and your children and your children's children, and your flocks, your herds, and all that you have; and there I will provide for you, for there are yet five years of famine to come; lest you and your household, and all that you have, come to poverty.' And now your eyes see, and the eyes of my brother Benjamin see, that it is my mouth that speaks to you. You must tell my father of all my splendor in Egypt, and of all that you have seen. Make haste and bring my father down here." Then he fell upon his brother Benjamin's neck and wept; and Benjamin wept upon his neck. And he kissed all his brothers and wept upon them; and after that his brothers talked with him. When the report was

heard in Pharaoh's house, "Joseph's brothers have come," it pleased Pharaoh and his servants well.

THE SECOND OLD TESTAMENT READING

Prokeimenon in tone 4 (Ps.115)

Reader: My vows unto the Lord will I pay in the presence of all His people.

Verse: I believed, wherefore I spake; I was humbled exceedingly.

The reading is from the book of Proverbs. (21:23-22:4)

He who keeps his mouth and his tongue keeps himself out of trouble. "Scoffer" is the name of the proud, haughty man who acts with arrogant pride. The desire of the sluggard kills him for his hands refuse to labor. All day long the wicked covets, but the righteous gives and does not hold back. The sacrifice of the wicked is an abomination; how much more when he brings it with evil intent. A false witness will perish, but the word of a man who hears will endure. A wicked man puts on a bold face, but an upright man considers his ways. No wisdom, no understanding, no counsel, can avail against the Lord. The horse is made ready for the day of battle, but the victory belongs to the Lord. A good name is to be chosen rather than great riches, and favor is better than silver or gold. The rich and the poor meet together; the Lord is the maker of them all. A prudent man sees danger and hides himself; but the simple go on, and suffer for it. The reward for humility and fear of the Lord is riches and honor and life.

Reader: Lord have mercy (*12 times*)

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; both now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

THE APOSTICHA IN TONE FIVE

I am rich in passions; I am clothed in vile garments of hypocrisy. Through lack of abstinence, I delight in foul deeds, and show a boundless lack of tender-heartedness. Cast before the gates of repentance, I despise my mind, thirsting for every blessing, but ill from lack of concentration. Make me, O Lord, like Lazarus, who was poor in sin, lest I receive no answer when I pray for the finger dipped in water to relieve my burning tongue. Make me to dwell in the bosom of Abraham, as the lover of mankind.

Verse 1. Unto Thee have I lifted up mine eyes, O thou that dwellest in heaven. Behold, as the eyes of servants look unto the hands of their masters, as the eyes of the handmaiden look unto the hands of her mistress, so do our eyes wait upon the Lord our God, until He take pity upon us.

THE HYMN OF SYMEON THE GOD-RECEIVER

Reader: Lord, now lettest thou Thy servant depart in peace, according to Thy word; for mine eyes have seen Thy salvation, which Thou hast prepared before the face of all people, a light to lighten the Gentiles and the glory of Thy people Israel.

THE LENTEN APOLYTIKIA, IN TONE FIVE

Rejoice, O Virgin Theotokos Mary full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women and blessed is the Fruit of thy womb, for thou hast borne the Savior of our souls. (*Prostration.*)

O baptizer of Christ, remember us all that we may be delivered from our iniquities; for to thee has been given the grace to intercede for us all. (*Prostration.*)

Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit.

Intercede for us, holy apostles and all the saints that we may be delivered from perils and sorrows; for we have acquired you as fervent intercessors before the Savior. (*Prostration.*)

Both now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Beneath thy compassions we take refuge, O Theotokos. Despise not our prayers in our necessity, but deliver us from harm, only pure, only blessed One. (*Simple metania*)

Reader: Lord, have mercy. (*40 times*)

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

Both now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

More honorable than the Cherubim, and more glorious beyond compare than the Seraphim, thou who without corruption bearest God the Word and art truly Theotokos: we magnify thee.

Leader: Through the prayers of our holy fathers, Lord Jesus Christ our God, have mercy on us, and save us.

Reader: Amen. O heavenly King, support our believing kings; confirm their faith; guide the nations; give peace to the world and preserve well this holy church. Grant repose to our departed fathers and brothers, in the dwelling-places of the righteous. Receive us in repentance and confession, for Thou art good and the Lover of mankind

THE PRAYER OF ST. EPHREM THE SYRIAN

All: O Lord and Master of my life, take from me the spirit of sloth, meddling, lust of power and idle talk. (*prostration*)

But give, rather, the spirit of chastity, humility, patience and love to thy servant. (*prostration*)

Yea, O Lord and King, grant me to see my own sins and not to judge my brother, for thou art blessed unto ages of ages. Amen. (*prostration*)

Then twelve reverences (with the sign of the Cross).

With each one we say: "O God, be gracious unto me a sinner."

Then the entire prayer without a break:

O Lord and Master of my life, take from me the spirit of sloth, meddling, lust of power and idle talk. But give, rather, the spirit of chastity, humility, patience and love to thy servant. Choir: Blessed be the name of the Lord, henceforth and for evermore. (3 times, with metania made each time)

Reader: Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. Both now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

PSALM 33

I will bless the Lord at all times, His praise shall continually be in my mouth. In the Lord shall my soul be praised; let the meek hear and be glad. O magnify the Lord with me, and let us exalt His name together. I sought the Lord, and He heard me, and delivered me from all my tribulations. Come unto Him, and be enlightened, and your faces shall not be ashamed. This poor man cried, and the Lord heard him, and saved him out of all his tribulations. The angel of the Lord will encamp round about them that fear Him, and will deliver them. O taste and see that the Lord is good; blessed is the man that hopeth in Him. O fear the Lord, all ye His saints; for there is no want to them that fear Him. Rich men have turned poor and gone hungry; but they that seek the Lord shall not be deprived of any good thing. Come ye children, hearken unto me; I will teach you the fear of the Lord. What man is there that desireth life, who loveth to see good days? Keep thy tongue from evil, and thy lips from speaking guile. Turn away from evil, and do good; seek peace, and pursue it. The eyes of the Lord are upon the righteous, and His ears are opened unto their supplication. The face of the Lord is against them that do evil, utterly to destroy the remembrance of them from the earth. The righteous cried, and the Lord heard them, and He delivered them out of all their tribulations. The Lord is nigh unto them that are of a contrite heart, and He will save the humble of spirit. Many are the tribulations of the righteous, and the Lord shall deliver them out of them all. The Lord keepeth all their bones, not one of them shall be broken. The death of sinners is evil, and they that hate the righteous shall do wrong. The Lord will redeem the souls of His servants, and none of them will do wrong that hope in Him.¹

Reader: It is truly meet to bless thee, O Theotokos, the ever blessed and all-blameless, and the mother of our God.

Leader: Most holy Theotokos, save us.

Choir: More honorable than the Cherubim, and more glorious beyond compare than the Seraphim, thou who without corruption bearest God the Word and art truly Theotokos: we magnify thee.

The Leader bows toward the icon of Christ on the iconostasis, saying:

Leader: Glory to thee, O Christ our God and our Hope, glory to thee.

All: Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, both now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen. Lord, have mercy. Lord, have mercy. Lord, have mercy. O Lord, bless.

THE DISMISSAL

Leader: O Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, through the intercessions of his all-immaculate and all-blameless holy Mother; of the holy, glorious and all-laudable apostles; of the Holy Myrrh-Bearer and Equal to the Apostles Mary Magdalene, protector of this community; of the holy and righteous ancestors of God, Joachim and Anna; of the Venerable Titus the wonderworker; Virgin-

martyr Theodora of Palestine; and the Martyrs Amphianus and Aidesius of Lydia, whose memory we celebrate, and of all the saints: have mercy on us, and save us, for Thou art good and lovest mankind.

All: Amen.

Then, facing the icon of Christ, on the iconostasis, the Leader says:

Leader: Through the prayers of our holy fathers, Lord Jesus Christ our God, have mercy on us, and save us. *Reader: Amen.*
